

ME1000-10-SRK INTERNAL COMBINATION VALVE BONNET SEAL REPAIR KIT



Disassembly


- 1. Remove Bonnet [10] from Body [11].
- Remove Bonnet O-ring [1] from Bonnet [10] and discard.
- 3. Remove Handle Nut [15], Lock Washer [14], Handle Data Plate [13] and Handle [12] from Bonnet [10] and retain.
- 4. Remove Gland Seal Assembly [2-8] and Spring [9]. Discard all internal Gland Assembly components [2-7]. Retain Gland Holder [8] and Spring.
 - NOTE: Removed Gland Assembly components may differ from Repair Kit.
- 5. Inspect Body [11] and Bonnet [10] and clean if necessary. Be sure the interior is free of dirt, residue, and foreign particles.

B. Re-assembly

- 1. Install Spring [9z] into Bonnet [10].
- Apply Lubriplate or equivalent grease to Gland O-ring
 and install onto Gland Holder [8].
- 3. Apply Lubriplate or equivalent grease to one Wiper O-Ring [4], Male Adapter Bushing [3], and inside of Gland Holder [8].
- 4. Apply Lubriplate or equivalent grease to outside of Female Adapter [6] and (2) V-Packs [5]. Fill inside of components with lubricant as shown.



Install one Wiper O-Ring [4], Female Adapter [6], (2)
 V-Packs [5], Bushing O-Ring (cut) [2] and Male
 Adapter Bushing [3] into Gland Holder [8] as shown below.



6. Apply Loctite #565 or equivalent thread sealant to threads of Gland Seal Assembly [2-8] and install into Bonnet [10]. Wipe away excess sealant.

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- 7. Install Bonnet O-ring [1] onto Bonnet [10]
- 8. Apply Loctite #242 or equivalent thread locker to Bonnet [10] threads.
- 9. Install Bonnet [10] into Body [11] and torque to minimum 50 ft-lbs.
- 10. Install Handle [12], Handle Data Plate [13], Lock Washer [14], and Handle Nut [15] onto Bonnet [10]. Tighten Handle Nut to 55-65 in-lb torque.
- 11. Connect the valve assembly outlet to a pressure source of at least 150 PSI. Check for leaks at all joints and at stem seal using a suitable leak detector solution such as "Marshall Excelsior" leak detector.
